

Budget Update

- Budget was approved on May 24 and submitted to the province
- Aligned programs and services to funding received
- The budget funds the Board's priorities of achievement, equity and well-being and aligns with the Education Plan
- Maximizes dollars to support students and the classroom
- Budget allows for K-3 curriculum implementation and 4-6 curriculum pilot
- Reserve levels ("rainy day fund") approximately three per cent, representing about 11 days of CBE operations









Alberta Education Funding Remained Flat Year-over-Year




Flat Funding and Increased Enrolment Means Lower Per-student Funding







Curriculum Update

- The Board has advocated for significant and meaningful change of the curriculum to best prepare students for their future.
- Concerns remain regarding design and content, as well as the timing of implementation due to the challenges of the pandemic.
- The Board continues to advocate for ongoing structured feedback opportunities to strengthen curriculum design and content for Grades 4-6.

Curriculum Update

- Alberta Education mandates curriculum.
- Teachers are experts in designing learning that meets the needs of students now and in the future.
- The Board of Trustees has full confidence in the ability of the CBE to provide quality education for all students.

K-6 Implementation and Supports Timeline









- 1. All Alberta schools implement ELAL (K-3), Mathematics (K-3), and PE&W (K-6) in fall 2022.
- 2. In CBE, small scale implementation in select schools for implementation of ELAL (4-6) and Mathematics (4-6) in fall 2022.
- 3. In CBE, decisions will need to be made regarding piloting K-6 Science, French Immersion Language Arts and Literature, and Fine Arts in fall 2022.

K-6 Curriculum Implementation and Supports Timeline . Final K-6 English Language Arts and Literature, Mathematics, and Physical Education and Wellness curricula are released, with supports on Alberta,ca and new LearnAlberta A parent and teacher support area on NLA called the Curriculum Implementation Information Hub (CIIH) is released. Resources are added to the CIIH to support teachers and system leaders with . Teacher videos and user guides are provided on NLA. . What is Curriculum?

INTENDED

The combination of formally identified learning outcomes with pedagogical approaches, created learning environments and accompanying resources

TAUGHT

How teachers bring the curriculum to life through designed learning activities and assessment practices

WRITTEN

Published government documents that outline the content students should learn

What does this mean in CBE?

What: The Alberta Programs of Study and written curriculum documents outline *what* students are to learn. They are foundational to teaching and learning.

Why: The purpose and reason why students engage with identified content comes from an understanding of the nature of a discipline and selected goals for learning. The why is included in the taught curriculum and may be directed by the written curriculum.

How: How content is taught is equally important to what content is taught. The CBE Education Plan and Frameworks outline how teaching and learning will be approached in CBE schools as teachers interpret the written curriculum and make it relevant for their students and unique contexts. Within CBE, the focus will be on designing and implementing curriculum through inclusive, equitable practices.

How well: Provincial and CBE assessment and reporting documents provide direction for how well students are expected to learn content.
