

COVID-19 Update

- More than 700 self-reported cases to date
- Informing families of self-reported cases in classrooms or schools
- 12 outbreak notices as of Sept. 28
- Trustees & administration advocating for more data to help us make decisions
- CBE meets or exceeds government health measures and will continue to do so
- Strongly encouraging vaccination for staff and eligible students











Health Measures

- Update to staff and parents by early next week
 - New government guidance Sept. 20
 - New health checklist
 - Some adjustments may be made to cohorting, unvaccinated close household contacts, field trip guidance etc.









Cbe-learn

- CBe-learn is a full-time, full-year learning option for students in Grades 1-12
- Full-time enrolment is 3,000+ students this year
- About 1,000 students transferred to Cbe-learn from the extra intake period from Aug. 23 to Sept. 2











Alberta Education Targeted Funding

- Focus on foundational literacy and numeracy
- Grade 2-3 assessments complete in September
- Grade 1 assessment begins in January
- Results submitted to Alberta Education
- \$45 M in targeted provincial funding for students struggling with reading and mathematics
- Annual diagnostic assessment is something teachers do across all grades, every year









Federal Support Summary

- Safe Return to School Funding \$45.7M
- CBE COVID related costs \$45.8M

Alberta School Council Engagement Grant

- Alberta government is providing more than \$1 million directly to school councils through the Alberta School Council Engagement Grant to enhance collaboration between parents and schools on education priorities. This grant gives each school council in the province \$500 this year under a new direct funding approach.
- CBE will provide school councils with funding allocation details once received from the Alberta government.
