Calgary Board of Education will hold public meetings to consider school closures

Calgary—Trustees with the Calgary Board of Education passed motions Tuesday to consider the closure of two school programs.

In the first motion, Trustees agreed to consider the closure of the Kindergarten to Grade Six program at Roland Michener School. In the second motion, Trustees agreed to consider the closure of the Grade 7 to Grade 9 Chinese (Mandarin) Bilingual Program at Langevin School and the transfer of the students registered in the programs to other schools.

As a result of the Board of Trustee’s responsibilities under the *School Act*, public meetings will be held for the purpose of discussing the possible program closures being considered by the Board of Trustees. The dates and locations for the public meetings are:
