The Board of Trustees is pleased to announce the release of our 2011 Report to the Community.

### **Choice and Voice**

Students are offered a variety of alternative programs including Early French Immersion; Late French Immersion; German Bilingual; Spanish Bilingual; Chinese(Mandarin) Bilingual; Arts Centered Learning; Traditional Learning Centre; Science School; Alice Jamieson Girl's Academy; Juno Beach Academy for Canadian Studies; Montessori; Piitoayis Aboriginal Family School; and Medicine Wheel.

Students are also able to access special services and outreach programs, which are identified in the report.

### **Academic Success**

CBE students' performance on provincial achievement tests and diploma exams continues to improve.

Looking to the future, our schools will implement strategies for students to participate in instructional design and assessment. By being flexible in timetabling and by supporting anytime anywhere access to learning technologies, students are provided a greater opportunity to be successful in their studies.

### **Citizenship**

CBE schools incorporate responsible citizenship into many of their activities and student learning opportunities. Many students raised funds to help victims of the earthquake in Haiti. Along with helping those less fortunate, students also learn about environmental causes and are invited to participate in local and provincial government initiatives involving youth.
