





Finish School your way with the Calgary Board of Education

Your guide to finishing high school and planning for ongoing success.

How do I confirm that I have graduated?

Alberta Education will send you an official diploma. If you have not received your official diploma in the mail contact your previous school or access myPass, <u>https://public.education.alberta.ca/PASI/mypass/welcome</u>. myPass provides you access to your Detailed Academic Report (DAR). If your DAR does not indicate you have met your graduation requirements, you require additional courses.

I have not graduated and/or I need to take additional courses.

The CBE can support you with your continued learning. Depending upon your age, tuition fees may apply. Read on...

There are three options to complete your high school education with the CBE:

Alberta High School Diploma You must complete a minimum of 100 credits in specific courses to receive an Alberta High School Diploma Website | https://www.alberta.ca/graduation-requirements-credentials-and-credits.aspx

Students who are enrolled in Knowledge and Employability courses and who satisfy the requirements receive a **Certificate of High School Achievement**. Website | <u>https://www.alberta.ca/education-guide-certificate-of-high-school-achievement-requirements-english.aspx</u>

If you have been out of school for at least 10 consecutive months, are 19 years of age as of September 1st, and you don't have the 100 credits needed for an Alberta High School Diploma, you may be able to earn a **High School Equivalency Diploma** (HED) through accumulated credits. Find the right school for you

Your Community School is a great place to start. Not certain which community school is yours? Use the find a school tool website at https://cbe.ab.ca/schools/find-a-school/Pages/default.aspx. To access your community school you must be younger than 19 as of September 1st. If you have not graduated and have completed three years of education at your community school, you may apply for a fourth year. If your application is not accepted by your school you may consider attending a CBE School of Choice.
