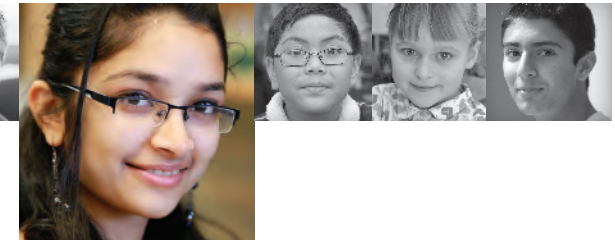

Who can attend the L.E.A.D program?

L.E.A.D. students

- have interrupted schooling due to the events in their country
- speak little English
- have limited or no literacy in English or their first language
- are recent arrivals to Canada
- may have a refugee immigration code and/or be assisted by refugee settlement services

What happens in L.E.A.D. classes?

- classes are small so students get a lot of extra help
- The focus in classes is English Language Development
- Lessons include mathematics, science, computer technology and Canadian culture
- Students in L.E.A.D. programs make significant gains in 20 months. They can transition to ESL or other classes in the school

How will my child get to the school?

Some students live close enough to the school to walk. Other students take a school bus, a taxi, or Calgary city transit.

What is the cost of the L.E.A.D. program?

For students in all our schools, there are some costs for transportation, materials and lunchroom. L.E.A.D. families can apply for a waiver of school fees.
