Guide to 2026-2027 School Fees



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About the School Fee Guide

The Calgary Board of Education (CBE) is committed to providing guidance to families and schools by outlining how school fees are established, communicated, collected, and managed to ensure transparency, consistency, and compliance with the *Education Act*, Alberta Education School Fees Regulation, and CBE administrative regulations.

Developed in 2024 and updated annually in keeping with provincial regulations, the School Fee Guide outlines the range of fees parents may be charged for extracurricular activities, complementary courses, and field trips.

Published each year on the CBE website, the guide provides detailed information to help parents and the public understand school-based fees and supports students' diverse learning experiences by promoting transparency around costs for the upcoming school year. These fees are separate from central fees such as those for school supplies, lunch supervision, and transportation.

Each school has the discretion to determine the fees they charge from an approved list. While the guide outlines maximum potential costs per student, individual schools set fees based on their unique needs, resources, and programming.

Guiding Principles

All school fees must be managed according to the following principles:

- **Equity & Access**
No student will be excluded from required instructional programming due to an inability to pay fees.
- **Transparency**
All fees must be clearly explained, published in advance, and communicated to families with sufficient detail.
- **Cost Recovery Only**
Fees may only recover the actual direct cost of goods or services provided.
- **Voluntary Participation**
Fees related to optional activities must be clearly identified as optional and not required for participation in core learning.

Responsibilities

Central Office is responsible for:

- Applying central fees correctly
- Issuing central fee notices
- Supporting schools with fee processes
- Reviewing and monitoring compliance
- Developing and updating the policy and fee structure

Schools are responsible for:

- Using approved common fee categories
- Applying school fees correctly
- Consulting with parents before determining or charging some fees reasonable for that school population
- Setting fees within approved limits
- Ensure all applicable fees are posted in MyCBE **before requesting payment** from families
- Maintaining transparency and communicating approved fees clearly

Families are responsible for:

- Reviewing and paying the fees
- Applying for waivers when eligible

Student Transfer Processes for Fees Assessed

When a student transfers to another CBE school

- Central Fees: No action.
- School Fees: The school is responsible for reviewing all school level fees and ensuring accuracy and payment of the charges before transfer. Outstanding school fees should be communicated to the parent/guardian in the form of a statement.
- Parent/Guardian: Responsible for reviewing the fee statements provided, ensuring prompt payment of any outstanding balances, and addressing any discrepancies with the school in a timely manner before the student transfer process is completed.

Student Transfer Between CBE Schools

- Central Fees: Review the student account to ensure the central fees are correctly assigned to the student and make appropriate action to enroll the student into the program or withdraw the student from the program (e.g. Lunch Supervision, Musical Instrument Rental, Transportation).
- School Fees: The receiving school is responsible for assigning, managing and communicating new school fees for the student.

Student Withdrawal from CBE

- Central Fees: Managed and reviewed by the central Student Fee team under the central-level student account.
- School Fees: Managed and reviewed by the school, to ensure the student's account is accurate for all school-level fee charges. Outstanding school fees should be communicated to the parent/guardian in the form of a statement.
- Parent/Guardian: Responsible for reviewing the fee statements provided, ensuring prompt payment of any outstanding balances, and addressing any discrepancies with the school in a timely manner before the student transfer process is completed.

Mandatory Rules for Fee Amounts

- Fees must not exceed the approved maximum
- Fees must not exceed actual cost (rounding up to the nearest dollar is permitted)
- Fees must not be bundled in a way that reduces transparency for families - However, when a school has a single contract and invoice covering multiple days for the same activity, the total cost may be combined and charged as one clearly labeled fee
 - *Example:*
YMCA 5-day swimming program → Fee name “YMCA Swimming (5 Days)” one fee instead of five separate daily fees

If the cost exceeds the maximum fee, the school must cover the difference using school funds.

Fee Charge Rules

Schools **may not** charge fees for:

- Instructional materials required to meet curriculum outcomes
- Textbooks or basic classroom supplies
- Paper and photocopying costs
- Access to core instructional programs

These costs are funded through Education and Childcare grants.

Schools **may charge** fees for the following, where applicable:

- Activities (e.g., field trips, cultural activities, clubs, courses, extracurricular programs)
- Optional goods or services (e.g., key study books, spirit wear, enhanced materials)

All such fees must follow the rules:

- Be clearly identified as optional or required
- Be transparent
- Reflect direct cost recovery only
- Be approved by school administration
- Be clearly communicated to families

Fee Structure

Central Fees (District Managed)

These are set centrally and are charged consistently across CBE:

- Transportation fees to help cover the cost of providing transportation services.
- Lunch supervision fees to cover CBE's paid lunch supervision service for students in Grades 1-6 and full-day Kindergarten. This service ensures a supervised and safe space for students to eat and remain on school grounds during the lunch period. The CBE charges an annual lunch supervision fee for students who stay at school over the lunch break (Grades K–6). This covers the

cost of supervision, not food. Some schools also allow drop-in use of lunch supervision and may charge a daily drop-in fee.

- Student supplies fees (SSF) apply to all students in Kindergarten through Grade 6. The fee offsets the cost of purchasing supplies like pens, pencils, and erasers so that students have the tools they need to learn from their first day in class.
- Music Instrument Rental (MIR) Fees collected in Grades 7-12 for instruments borrowed from CBE and must be used toward the cost of cleaning, general maintenance, replacement and repair of musical instruments [AR 7007 Musical Instruments](#).

These central fees are designed to offset the cost of services and are transparent through the annual [Budget & Financial Information](#).

School-Based Fees (Set by Individual schools)

These are optional or enhancement-oriented fees tied directly to specific goods, services, or experiences. School-based fees are listed in the School Fee Guide, which is published annually, and vary based on each school's programs and offerings. Fees are designed to offset the cost of services and are made transparent through the annual Report to Parents on Fees, which must be published by **November 30** and posted on each school's website.

Athletic Fees (Extracurricular Activities)

Athletic fees relate to Grade 7-12 extracurricular or athletic activities that take place outside of regular instructional hours, such as soccer, swimming, basketball, and other sports. These fees are charged to support student participation in organized school sport programs.

Athletic fees may include:

- Team Fees – league or athletic association registration fees, officiating costs, and related organizational expenses, external facility rentals
- Tournament Fees – costs associated with local, provincial, or out-of-province tournaments, including registration, accommodation, transportation, meals, and substitute teacher coverage where applicable
- Celebration Costs – team celebrations such as certificates, awards, trophies, banquets, or recognition events
- Equipment and Apparel – safety equipment, required sport-specific items and uniform rental, equipment rental
- Training or Workshops – external facility rentals, external coaches or trainers, professional development sessions, and associated transportation costs

Complementary Courses Fees

Complementary courses fees apply to specific academic or elective courses in which students choose to enroll. Course fee names align with the groupings identified in the [Complementary Courses and Programs of Choice document](#) and assignment of course fees are only eligible for grades 7-12 to comply with [Guide to Education](#) requirements.

Complementary courses fees may include:

- Consumable materials used by students
- Rental or cost of specialty equipment and apparel required for course delivery
- Safety equipment necessary for participation
- Course-related software or digital resources
- Certification or examination costs associated with the course
- Non-CBE facility space rental costs
- Transportation costs related to course requirements

Field Trip Fees

Field trip fees apply to educational outings or excursions where students travel outside the classroom to support curriculum outcomes or gain real-world learning experiences.

Field trip fees may include:

- Transportation costs
- Admission or program fees
- Accommodation costs, where required
- Meal costs, where required
- Facility / space rental
- Substitute cost
- Consumable materials
- Other

In-School Activity

In-school fees apply to events, programs, or activities that take place within the school building during regular school hours or as part of the normal school schedule. These activities are organized by the school and are intended to enhance educational experience.

In-school fees may include:

- Consumable materials used during the activity (e.g., art supplies, science materials)
- Specialty supplies required for participation
- Guest presenter or workshop fees
- Licensing or usage fees for educational programs or performances
- Course or activity-specific materials that students keep
- Technology or software access fees, where required for the activity

General Fees

General fees apply to optional school activities, programs, or events that enhance students' learning and school experience beyond the regular curriculum. These may include participation in clubs, enhancement programs, alternative programs, or graduation-related activities.

General fees may include:

- Transportation to and from events or program locations
- Admission or registration fees for activities, performances, or competitions
- Accommodation costs, if overnight stays are required

- Meals, where necessary for supervision or participation
- Materials or supplies needed for the program
- Equipment and apparel rental or usage fees
- Specialist facilitators, instructors, or presenters for the activity
- Celebration or ceremony costs, such as awards, certificates, or decoration

School Store Sale, Rental and Individual Assessment

School Store Sales, Rental Fees and Individual Assessment or Replacement Fees **are not part of this School Fee Guide**. These fees are optional and apply only to students who choose to purchase/rent items from the school store or need to replace lost or damaged items, such as:

- School store merchandise (e.g., apparel, yearbooks, recorders or extra study materials)
- Optional Rental (School-Owned or External Equipment)
- Replacement of lost or damaged textbooks, library books, or school property
- Technology replacement or repair costs

Communication with Parents

The Calgary Board of Education (CBE) is committed to clear, transparent communication with families about fees so parents and guardians can understand, plan, and manage costs associated with their children's education. This communication must meet both CBE policy requirements and Education and Childcare regulation expectations.

Central Fees — Communication by CBE Student Fees Team

The CBE Student Fees central team must provide families with timely and accessible information about central fees (e.g., transportation, lunch supervision, student supplies), including:

- Annual fee assignment: Families must be provided with a schedule of central fees, including an approximate timing of when fees will be assigned and due throughout the school year (start of school, as registered, mid-year adjustments, year-end refunds).
- Website updates: Updated fee information must be posted on the official CBE Fees & Waivers pages on cbe.ab.ca so families can access the most current fee tables and background information at any time.
- Email distribution: Individual communication (e.g., notifications or reminders about registering and paying for lunch supervision or transportation services) should be distributed via email or other appropriate communication channels.
- Families must have clear and easy access to information about centralized fee waiver options, including eligibility criteria and application processes. This should include step-by-step directions for applying for a waiver through MyCBE, as well as a clear statement that families may request a waiver if they are experiencing financial hardship.

School-Level Communication Requirements

Schools must ensure families receive clear and complete fee information for all school-based fees and optional services, including:

- Purpose and cost: A plain-language explanation of what each fee is for and what it is included.
- Optional vs. required: Clear identification of whether each fee is optional (voluntary) or required (necessary to participate in a program or service).
- Refund policies: Information on how and when refunds are processed, including what refund criteria apply if an activity is cancelled or a student withdraws.
- Visibility in MyCBE: Fees assigned to each student must be visible and accessible in the MyCBE portal so parents can view, pay, and track their account online.

Respectful and Confidential Fee Conversations

When parents or guardians contact the school regarding fees, all interactions should be handled respectfully, professionally, and confidentially. Both CBE staff and families share responsibility for ensuring these conversations are constructive and supportive. Schools are encouraged to ensure that:

- Fee conversations are adult-to-adult, focused on information and support rather than confrontation.
- Families are supported with information about payment options and central fee waivers if affordability is a concern.
- Communication upholds dignity and privacy, understanding that financial circumstances vary across families.

Parents/Guardians are expected to:

- Engage in respectful, calm, and constructive communication when discussing school fees.
- Seek clarification or support through appropriate school channels when concerns arise.
- Maintain respectful dialogue that supports collaborative problem-solving.
- Respect the privacy and professionalism of school staff during these discussions.

Age of Student and Communication Rights

For students over 18 years old, direct communication may accompany or complement parental communication, consistent with privacy and consent guidelines.

The [Education Act](#) defines an [Independent Student](#) as 18 years of age or older, regardless of where they live. The *Protection of Privacy Act* (POPA) of Alberta requires the CBE to disclose information to students who are the age of majority and then only to others with the written consent of the Independent Student. This information may include, but is not limited to, outstanding fee information, attendance records, parent/teacher conferences, field trips, suspensions, report cards and similar matters.

As an Independent Student, the individual assumes responsibility for their financial account, including any fees incurred after reaching the age of 18.

Responsibility for any outstanding fees incurred prior to the student reaching 18 years of age remains with the parent or legal guardian.

An Independent Student may choose to authorize their parent or legal guardian to access and review their financial account. To do so, the student must complete and submit the Release Independent Student Information form. The form can be obtained from the school. This authorization allows the designated individual to view account information and assist with fee management.

Waiver Eligibility

Independent Students who experience financial hardship may apply for a fee waiver. Additional information regarding waivers can be found on the [CBE Waiver](#) page.

Refund Policy

A clear refund policy helps families understand when refunds are available, how they are processed, and what limitations apply. CBE guidance emphasizes transparency, fairness, and alignment with actual costs incurred.

Refunds may be issued when:

- A program, activity, or service is cancelled by the school or CBE
- A student withdraws before the activity or service begins, and costs have not yet been incurred
- Exceptional circumstances are reviewed and approved by the school or central department

Refunds may not be available when:

- Costs have already been incurred (e.g., registrations, materials purchased, transportation booked, Terms and Conditions)
- Items are personal or consumable (e.g., apparel, yearbooks, supplies, music instrument rental)
- Fees relate to optional purchases such as school store sales

Partial refunds may be considered when:

- Only part of the program or service has been delivered (e.g. complementary course fee drop)
- Recoverable costs remain after expenses are deducted

Refund Process

- Refund requests must be submitted through the school or by contacting StudentFees@cbe.ab.ca
- All refund requests are reviewed in accordance with [CBE Administrative Regulation AR 7005 – School Fees](#) and applicable school procedures
- Approved refunds will be issued by school cheque or returned to the original method of payment, where possible
- Refunds will be initiated following approval and confirmation of required documentation, in accordance with applicable terms and conditions
- Families will receive confirmation once the refund has been approved and processed
- Refunds must be issued by the end of the school year when a student's net overpayment exceeds \$20.00 after all adjustments and internal transfers on the student account are completed

Fee Adjustment Rules

Fees must be based solely on actual direct costs required to deliver the activity, goods or service. The following cost recovery thresholds apply to Enhanced Educational and/or Non-curricular Activities, Goods or Services:

- If the actual direct cost differs from the fee charged by more than \$10.00 per student, the school must complete a Fee Adjustment.
- When the difference is \$10.00 or less, no fee adjustment is required and excess funds may be retained and used for incidental expenses that directly benefit the students for whom the fee was collected, and for purposes related to the original activity, good or service.

Fee adjustments must not result in an increase in the original fee charged.

For example:

In-School Activity **Phys Ed & Wellness**

- a) Fee charged \$25.00 per student
- b) Student account payment \$25.00
- c) Actual direct costs \$18.00 per student
- d) Excess of fee revenue vs. direct costs \$7.00 per student (< \$10.00 per student)

Expected Action: Excess funds will be reasonably used for incidental expenses related to the activity, good or service and for the benefit of the students for whom the fee was originally collected

For Student Account = \$0 nothing owing, no adjustments

Field Trip out of province Sea / Sailing

- a) Fee charged \$2,000 per student
- b) Student account payment \$2,000
- c) Actual direct costs \$1,550 per student
- d) Excess of fee revenue vs direct costs \$450 per student (> \$10.00 per student)

Expected Action: Edit Fee within MyCBE from \$2,000 to \$1,550 per student

For Student Account = **Overpayment of \$450** on account

Financial Waivers and Support

The CBE has a waiver process for families who can't afford to pay the fees. Visit our [Waivers](#) page for more information and the documents required as proof of income and extraordinary circumstances.

- CBE is committed to providing quality educational programming with reasonable Fees.
- No student will be denied access to core instructional programming due to an inability to pay.

Central Fee Waiver

Waiver applications for the current school year are found online through your [MyCBE](#) account and are available from the start of the school year until June 30.

Approved applications will have the following fees, if applicable, waived for the school year:

- Transportation
- Lunch supervision
- Student supplies
- Musical instrument rental

School-based fees are not covered by the waiver. This includes items such as:

- Course fees
- Activities
- Field trips
- Goods/services

School based fees waiver can be approved by the school principal.

School-based Fee Waivers

In accordance with [AR 7005 School Fees](#), principals may waive school-based fees for enhanced educational goods and services (e.g. complementary course fees, field trips etc.) or non-curricular goods and services (e.g. sports teams, clubs, etc.) for independent students or families and may also approve partial payments or payment plans.

All families requesting a waiver for school-based fees or central fees must first apply through the Central Fee Waiver assessment process.

While principals retain full discretion over school-based fee waiver decisions, the results of the central waiver assessment serve as an important factor in the overall consideration.

The central waiver assessment reviews:

- A family's financial circumstances
- Any extraordinary circumstances that may impact the family's ability to pay fees

Assessments are completed using consistent, compassionate, and evidence-based practices by staff with backgrounds in social work, counselling, and finance. This standardized approach promotes fairness and transparency and provides principals with reliable information to support informed decision-making.

School Responsibilities and Process

Families who may need financial support are encouraged to apply for a fee waiver.

1. Applying for a Fee Waiver
 - Families can apply for a fee waiver through their [MyCBE](#) account.
 - The application helps assess financial need and any exceptional circumstances that may impact the ability to pay fees.
2. Application Review
 - Once submitted, applications are reviewed and families will be notified of the outcome.
3. School-Based Fee Decisions
 - Families may be asked to connect with their school regarding next steps after receiving their result.
 - Schools will work with families to determine appropriate support for school-based fees.
 - Final decisions regarding school-based fee waivers are made at the school level.
