## Schools Impacted by New School Openings - Area V

April 14, 2016

Public Engagement Feedback

A Public Engagement session was held at Nickle School on April 14, 2016, to provide information on schools impacted by new school openings and to collect feedback on the opportunities for using additional space in schools to best meet the learning needs of students, families, and the community. Approximately 200 people attended this engagement and were asked to provide feedback on opportunities developed in collaboration with principals. Please note: Any inappropriate comments have been omitted.

### General Comments:

- Bring back foundational building blocks of education rather than keep exploring so many specialist schools (+1+1+1+1 additional support)
- Consider providing full lunch service for the children
- Ensuring healthy options
- Nickel School
- Community schools disciplinary regulations need to be seriously considered. In addition, parents should have a clear visibility of what is being taught at school where a child can be supported.
- Promise to bus to Nickle until 17-18 yr is that still true & happening? Why not for RT Alderman?
- My son was in French immersion K-5 at Sam Livingston & then Fairview. I pulled him out of Fairview because the population was ridiculous (1100 students, 750 when my daughter attended). The decision was very difficult and made after many months of consideration. For grade 6 he moved to RT our community school. The BEST decision we could have made. Now the school is being annihilated & divided and 2nd half of year with 230 students. I am concerned about the future of the school. I also think families in Cranston & Copperfield should have right to stay if they want.
- What will happen at John Ware with decreased enrollment at Woodman?
- Should be having these discussions when new school locations are being planned and consulted on
- Divide Area V up too big
- Should have these discussions as a workshop to hear more opinion.
- Why bother opening a school mid-year? Not worth the disruption and costs for busing
- Could kids stay at Alderman until graduation and have bus funding for both 2017-2018?
- Walking to school teaches a healthy lifestyle!
- Return to k-6 model
- Look at students going to out of boundary schools for regular program.
   This shouldn't happen
- Incentivize enrollment at local/community school via transportation fees.
   (+1 additional support)
- Consider not providing CBE transportation to community schools and invest dollars saved into the school
- Teachers with multicultural or diverse background foreign trained teachers

- Communicate more with the working world outside of education. Very hard to coordinate work schedules with schools that don't offer Friday PM and afterschool care so more schools to find a school that offers this
- Ditto (to previous comment)
- Maps on website ASAP
- Repurpose buildings/schools to "age" with the surrounding communities' population
- What is the time horizon for these changes ie) as neighbourhoods turn over (aging) will changes occur? 5 year, 10 years later?
- Overcapacity schools should be an integral part of the planning process when opening new facilities
- As a tax payer, why open new schools midyear when we know school may not open on time. Running 2 schools within one is ridiculous
- Keep Gr 8 & 9 Cranston & Copperfield at RTA. With bussing in 2013 Cranston was promised 5 yrs bussing to Nickle or move to RTA. Nickle still has bussing for 2 more yrs from Cranston. Why not RTA? If bussing is the problem, hire City Transit like Cranston to Lord Beaverbrook
- No parent engagement from RTA prior to now. Lose-Lose for families in Cranston/Copperfield and families staying at RTA. Only consulted with Elementary parents in Cranston who understandably are happy. Kids already not in Cranston are heartbroken to leave friends, teachers, programming.
- Cranston families didn't tell their children at RTA to only make friends with Cranston kids. Where is best interest of the student?
- Concerned about the fact that RT Alderman will have 2 schools in 1 building for 6 months and then disrupt all the students when they are moved out half way through the school year. This is very disruptive to everyone
- Many friendships that have been developed in already tough years for kids are being taken away
- Until 3 weeks ago Public was told Gr 4 & 5 only for first year. Now too late for transfers or any consultation
- Would like to see broad population demographic changes
- Construction updates would be nice.
- Smaller teacher/student ratio.
- Affected schools planning should begin when new school approved.
   What a blow to families and communities to have such uncertainty and changes (closures) on such short notice.
- It was disappointing and overwhelming for us parents because CBE for the longest time wasn't able to clarify as to what was to be done in the coming year 2016-2017. My son was sent to McKenzie Lake school from Cranston in kindergarten and during the school year we heard different rumors about the Cranston school taking its students back. It was quite disturbing for us and we did not even want our son to know because he would be upset. I think it's fair on our part to know before hand as to what the CBE decides for the future of our kids. Instead of parents gossiping in the school grounds it should have been clarified from the office. McKenzie school did not accept forms for kindergarten for my second one and only then did I know about whatever was going on. I hope for a more responsible attitude in future.
- When the decision is made to build a new school, a plan for the old school should be developed. The enrolment decreases at the old school not only due to the kids moving to the new school but also because parents do not know what the plan is for the old school. The entire time that a school is being built, the families at the old school are frustrated

- and nervous as the impact on their school. It is a big unknown as to the impact for current and potential families.
- Please put resources into Andrew Sibbald so that children don't transfer to PrinceOf.Wales or Catholic for support.
- People are moving their children to Catholic and PrinceOfWales school because they feel there are specific resources for their child's needs.
- Do not open the new school mid-year that is a waste of taxpayers' money!!
- No bussing for Cranston kids they should go to their new schools, less stress & less crowded schools.
- Keep Maple Ridge and R.T.A schools available & open!
- Expand arts/drama/music programs
- Have in schools help (like tutoring) for kids that may need it.
- Larger text on the charts please, very hard to read.
- Keep Andrew Sibbald open!
- It would be greatly appreciated if bus routes are not changed unless there is a dramatic increase/decrease in student population.
- Opening the new schools mid-year is not a smart idea!
- The Maple Ridge School because it can not close the school we want to let it stay open.
- Quit wasting money opening the new schools mid-year. Leave them closed until the "real" school year. Allow the division grade to finish where they are.
- Encourage healthy habits in our students by providing scooter and skateboard racks for minimal cost and bureaucracy. Kids want to get to and from school self-propelled; not to rely on a bus or parent to drive them.
- I was expecting more option discussion; I have already provided this level of input.
- CBE needs to better coordinate between consultations, 3 in 1 week is too hard to get too.
- We have grown to fill 6 schools we build 16 = does not make sense. Sacrificing quality for quantity, we need more resources to help all children succeed sharing resource teachers amongst many children invest in what we have already built; not cast it off and hope a new school will fix old problems. All children deserve the right to read, write, and understand simple math. Build a solid foundation within walking distance of one's community.

#### Language and Non-Language Alternative Programs:

- Up the number of dual-track programs at schools with low enrolment so community kids can attend their community school and Calgary parents can choose the alternative program (science, arts, STEM, LD, athletics...)
- Attract others to attend schools arts or other programs for Maple Ridge
- Feeder for Willow Park
- Bring in specialized programming such as "art" to attract students
- Sport, science, TLC as priority
- Lake Bonavista is a close community and needs to have a strong TLC community school Andrew Sibbald is currently the only TLC school in the community and it needs to be built up making it a k-6 would be a draw for a lot of people. There are many people leaving Bonavista for school only because the schools in Parkland offer k-6, many people feel gr.5 is too young for junior high

- Zero alternative programs in SE communities 2016
- I strongly want/request TLC program to be one (junior high and elementary) before. One hour difference in morning and evening has impacted our lives big time. As my second one starting junior high now, I might have to lose my job just to do 4 different school runs in a day. Thanks a lot.
- Choose dual track over one program.
- Should have more dual-track immersion programs creates more options/capacity across system & Area
- Have seen that transition to middle schools can create challenges if no OSC (out of school care) available
- Language specialty programs (+1 additional support)
- Language school
- Education thru the Arts community school feeder to other middle school ART focused program (+1+1+1+1 additional support)
- Trades focused schools
- Science/math specialty schools in more districts (SE)(+1+1)
- Pairing elementary & middle schools that offer alternative programs should be geographically close
- E.g. Sam Livingston & Nickle French Immersion Fairview + Le Roi Daniels – TLC
- Consider language alternative programs in new schools
- Consider a non-Catholic Art based elementary school in line with Willowpark and Beaverbrook ie Maple Ridge (+1 additional support)
- Consider revenue generating programs (after hours/rental/sports programs) to offset student underutilization
- Full day kindergarten as required offered in other provinces (B.C. and Ontario) – example Andrew Sibbald
- Science School in the south
- Why isn't their money for my children to have a good education in their community when there is money to send children all over for specialties?
- Need a Mandarin bilingual jr high in south. There is only 1 in city. No other choices to continue language after elementary currently. Create Mandarin language option at Jr. Highs
- Move programs to decreasing populations schools
- This might provide the opportunity for the non-language students some exposure to a new language
- Schools with a wider world view
- If dollars is an issue, why does CBE offer all these alternative programs?
   Making all community schools the same would save so much bussing dollars (+1+1+1+1+1 additional support)
- Add to above educating children the same (ie less alternative programs) adds to the sense of community. Similar experiences build familiarity and belongingness. Separate programs builds differences in community and division in communities – division = decrease tolerance = CONFLICT (+1 additional support)
- Alternative programs dilute effectiveness and reduce efficiency. CBE should offer 1 standard program to maximise effectiveness. The less students enrolled in a programme the higher the per student cost. This is not what we want (+1 additional support)

  equitable for all Calgarians to subsidize these costs.
- Alt programs south K-4 arts programs to feed into Willow Park.
- Could make a science and math focused school!
- Make Le Roi Daniels & Fairview school on the main TLC campus in Area
   5. Remove French immersion from Fairview. Reduce the waiting list for admission, more space for student increased. Thank you.
- Remove French immersion from Fairview TLC School, to make Le Roi Daniels and Fairview one TLC campus for area V.
- Consider opening dual track schools upon start up so that parents do not need to make hard decisions of pulling out kids out of FIA to regular programs due to location.
- Offer late Spanish bilingual programs eg; start grade 4 or grade 7
- Need to have French immersion offered in SE of the city in some of the new school locations.
- Prefer French and Spanish over other programs (make dual track)
- Dual track approach
- Move the French immersion program out of Fairview to RT Alderman, lots of space there.
- French from Fairview to RT Alderman.
- Move French to RT Alderman TLC should stay at Fairview as the elementary (Le Roi) share the same field.
- Move kids from Fairview to RT Alderman for grades 5-9 (French Immersion).
- French and/or Spanish bilingual program.
- Offer bi-ling mandarin.
- It would be nice to have a bilingual French program instead of just immersion.
- What about up French #'s at Chinook Park? Causes up @ Panabaker, will the French program bump out the English?
- The overcapacity of Fairview should be considered in this planning. Amalgamating the middle schools of Alderman & Nickel and relocating the French immersion program to the vacant school makes sense. TLC is growing, French immersion is growing and this would keep each facility open while improving the learning experience for the students who won't be jammed into overflowing classrooms.
- Fairview is too full. Move French immersion to RT Alderman.
- There is so much want for the TLC/French programs at Fairview and Le Roi Daniels. We would like to see the school have and run this program at Maple Ridge and RT Alderman. I have tried and tried and tried for many years to apply but get turned away because this program is full and only offered to selected people.

- Specialty programing leads to costly bussing issues and less community engagement.
- Could consider adding non-language program to Andrew Sibbald (shared space) to help it remain functional i.e; math/science/arts
- Education should focus on the basics and after/school/extra-curricular provides interest engagement.
- Provide more science base schools. Wait list is currently years.
- Wait for TLC and French immersion is super long they should introduce these programs to the regular schools like RT & Maple Ridge.
- French immersion should be with another language not at Fairview with the traditional program.
- French immersion K-6
- Offering a K-4 arts based learning in Calgary. Only the CCSD board offers this!
- Converting old schools to alternative only leads to more busing or more traffic
- Sam Livingston is now more than 50% community students (Lake Bon & Willow Park) change boundaries and make Sam Livingston K-6. Change Nickle to 7-9 (Late immersion, French & English) with closer boundaries. We chose an established community because of amenities (like schools) Lake Bonavista is turning and younger families are moving in. As Canada's other official language, offering French immersion is important.
- Maple Ridge/RT Alderman program preferences: sport, French, Spanish, TLC or Alt or science.
- Move some kids TLC or French out of Fairview to another area school, it's way overcrowded.
- Program is invaluable to working parents! If needed add an alternative program to both schools, art, science, Spanish, tlc, just don't close them!
- fine arts focus science dual track?
- Focus more on sports, the Catholic school focused on hockey and enrolment went up. Soccer is big in this city, maybe focus on that or dance/gymnastics.
- Offer programming to attract kids "sports" "arts"
- Using low enrollment or empty schools for alternative programs is a good idea to utilize the asset. – committing to appropriate maintenance on existing schools keeping them current
- More than 1 high school (in South) with arts/fine arts focus
- There is a reason there are long waitlists at charter schools, and a growing community of home-schoolers. CBE can offer more programs that would attract these students, increasing funding to CBE. Bussing is an issue that needs more thought, but should not be a reason to reduce alternative programming. Some children thrive in a traditional environment and some do not
- Dual track system in declining school works. Consider year round schooling to alleviate bussing and growth issues
- Arts centred learning at the k-4 level
- Science school alternative (heavy mathematics as well)
- Computer science teaching kids to code
- Program changes before waitlist situation
- Chinook to Fairview/Sam Livingston to Panabaker makes more sense geographically
- Instead of bilingual, additional language subjects should be taught. For example a class of German/Spanish, but regular teaching in English only. More language subjects should be offered. E.g. Urdu, etc.
- Use resulting available capacity to alleviate crowding at other schools.

- For example move French immersion out of Fairview to its own location. Fairview's current 2-3 students to a locker are not necessary or acceptable. As well looking at the Fairview test scores over the past few years, these students are well behind other CBE French Immersion students. Grades 5/6 were sent to Fairview due to lack of space at original schools. It is time to make these students a priority.
- Or use an empty school for French immersion grades 4-6 or 5-6 etc.
   Moving some kids out of Sam Livingston would reduce crowding in that school. Kids might even get a lunch room instead of eating in the hallway.
- Do not add new language or program schools. Put more effort into improving current programs instead of more watered down education options.

## **High Schools:**

- There is no French IB program in our area V.
- Day care programs for special needs middle school high school children.
- Kids won't like leaving junior and their peers to attend a totally different high school. i.e; Waldon legacy. I hope the system tries to keep communities together and isn't just numbers based.

# Other Opportunities:

- Before and after school care K-4
- I love the idea of opening Woodman up for seniors to utilize as well, it would be wonderful to link age groups.
- Make it easier for 3rd party programs to come into school and provide after school programs.
- Before and after care in some of the classrooms
- Utilize the asset for seniors
- Before and after school options will this be considered if a closure decision is made?
- RT Alderman has a pool in the basement not used.... Why not use current facilities?
- Pre-school programs lease space in community schools
- Supports transition to kindergarten.
- Before and after school care at K-4 school would be great.
- Would love to see a full day kindergarten. I would suggest two full days and alternating Fridays which is as good as four half days and alternating Fridays.
- A.S.E is an updated and modernized facility great gym, learning grounds and library. Engage Sibbald families in finding out how we can fill the school again. There is a profoundly strong and engaged parent group at this school.
- (Maple Ridge) with added space in schools, offer more before and after school programs at inner city schools ie; TOPP kids
- Would love to see half day daycare for kindergarten students at Andrew Sibbald. Or full day kindergarten every other day to help working families/single parent families.
- Agreed. Kindergarten daycare offered!

- Before and after school care is vital to many families. It is unfortunate that some families can't participate in their preferred program because there is no before/aftercare program.
- Stop spending so much money on bussing it takes away valuable resources to student learning.
- Providing seniors programs in Maple Ridge/Willow Park area, great idea.
- Build revenues by leasing space to the community.
- Smaller school districts with focus on local communities, maybe 12 instead of 5.
- Inconsistent approach to grade mixing (K-4/K-6/K-9/5-9
- Some communities that have aged and priced themselves beyond overage pay must force school closures. Not everyone can be saved!!
- Busing sucks, we have to find a better way.
- Not clear how school boundaries are devised. Make area V smaller so it can focus.
- Strengthen extra-curric opportunities such as non-clubs, school gardens.
- Kids are growing up quickly; I don't like the idea of starting middle school sooner
- Community use spaces Child care, events, community projects, use the extra space like a comm. Centre.
- Lease space to alternative programs like: CBE Learn, Home-schooling, STOP program.
- "Outdoor" schools (if attached to existing school would require alternate outdoor space....fish creek?)
- Schools with other organizations in shared buildings. This would need to be age appropriate/safety considered relationships.

## **Unique Setting:**

- There has to be more special needs placements.
- create more ASD programs as currently 3 schools that accommodate 24 kids we have 170,000 kids in YYC a good pct need ASD program keep ASD at Maple Ridge Keep also RT Alderman so good transition
- I would like R.T Alderman to be utilized as a school for mindfulness. Where children learn about the neuroscience behind the "science" so they can learn to understand the stressors and how to manage their behavior. We could specialize in ADD/ADHD, learning difficulties/socialization. The school has a pool, exercise room and as the ease to become the CBE model for public school. There is one in Edmonton, Vancouver and many many US cities.
- Mind Up tested program in Vancouver, no spiritual connection.
- Keep ASD cluster program at Maple Ridge, possibly use the extra capacity to expand unique setting programs there.
- Keep the transition track to R.T.A
- Maple Ridge:
- Utilize extra space for learning disabled children their needs are separate than other students i.e; their complex challenges require more one on one teaching.
- Results: LD get better opportunities to learn and regular students have less disruptions in class.
- LD require more aids, learning tools, educational instruction.
- All students can still mingle at recess, lunch, assemblies.
- Our family experience over the years is that integrating various children into a class setting does not offer quality education for any.
- Strongly disagree, this comment is moving us all backwards....

- Long term STOP program K-9 or K-6
- Use space within schools for temporary programs like the STOP program or short term early intervention programs for learning disabled students.
- Special needs with behavioral school at Maple Ridge.
- Keep ASD cluster at Maple Ridge. Kids in the program do better with consistency. The school is a great school with caring staff. Would be sad to see it closed.
- Special programs such as CSSI/Skills are valuable for our children.
   There is an urgent need as schools like Providence are overflowing and so few schools offer anything.
- What happens to ASD kids when supports are moved to the new schools? MR & RTA
- The idea of having a class for kids with mental illness was talked about at Andrew Sibbald, focusing on kids with anxiety etc. perhaps that could be more than one class? Or move the kids in Grade 5 & 6 to Andrew Sibbald and create the same mental illness/anxiety class at Nickel as well. That age is a tough time/transition and I think it would be good to continue it through middle school and high school.
- Maple Ridge school Keep ASP cluster at Maple Ridge

- Needs to stay open K-6, All day kindergarten
- More extensive resource rooms or facilities in community schools so that children do not have to seek other communities
- Offer k-6 regular program as a big reason people don't chose community schools is because it is only k-4
- Move to k-6 (+1+1 additional support)
- Keep communities together
- Keep k-6, 7-9, 10-12
- There seems to be so many choices...fewer choices for programs would cost less money!!!

- Smaller marketing school with a special focus offering childcare before and after – extracurricular opportunities for community
- LOWER ENROLLMENT IDEAS
- Many, many parents in Lake Bonavista are choosing specialty, immersion, Montessori and out of community programs when their children enter the system based on concerns about their ten year old young children going to a middle school with older children (Doesn't that school go to k-4 only?) that why we are going to \_\_\_\_, \_\_\_, or \_\_\_\_)
- K-4 is the most common reason for not going to the community schools
- Change Maple Ridge to k-6 and Acadia k-6, then merge David Thompson with RT Alderman in RT school
- Neighbourhood enrollment at Andrew Sibbald dropped by approximately 125 students when the school moves from k-6 to k-4 – is this proportional to the number of student in Grades 5 & 6 – seems like many parents chose other k-6 opportunities

People want K-6 in a public school. Lake Bonavista is growing and changing over to a younger generation with younger families. Please provide the public K-6 option.
- Could continue to bus in communities with no school.
- Combine neighborhood community schools into one location.
- We bought our home in a neighborhood with established schools so that our child would not need to leave the community to attend school (Maple Ridge). We need a solution that keeps community programs intact.
- Make R.T Alderman a K-9 school and expand boundaries to allow children from Acadia & Willow Park to attend.
- I want my kids to meet and create friendships with kids in their community. School is the place where long term friendships are formed.

- Community schools in existing established neighborhoods are vital to the survival of the community; they foster ownership and bring residents together. E.g; Haysboro is seeing more young school aged children move in as its original residents move out & keeping existing community schools open (e.g; Woodman) creates a foundation for a new generation of people engaged and passionate about their communities.
- Andrew Sibbald: K-6 program will draw families to the program, offer other programs (GATE, science, arts)
- Be a strong community school.
- Could expand grades K-6 to increase enrolment.
- Combine Acadia and Maple Ridge which are within walking/biking distance.
- Maple Ridge: conversion of school from K4 to K6, conversion of RT to specialty school.
- Keep community school programs and single grade classes. Full day kindergarten program.
- Changing Andrew Sibbald to K-6 would help enrolment and be better than a 5-9 program. Mixing grade 5 with grade 9 is too big of a transition.
- Andrew Sibbald is an extremely valuable resource and should be maintained as a regular program.

- Consider languages other than English being taught via 1 to 2 lesson per week – not necessarily only immersion.
- If keeping Nickle 5-9, add a playground for the younger children.
- I drive my 2 children from Riverbend to R.T Alderman for all the wonderful things offered. Now you are making it a shell. Taking away all the kids.
- Maple Ridge keep school Maple Ridge open, find other schools with capacity issues and longer bus routes & re-route kids.
- Consider joining Maple Ridge and Acadia in hopes to have a school with higher enrolment, also consider K-6 rather than K-4.
- Andrew Sibbald: we purchased in Lake Bonavista because we have a community school. Allow us to keep a solid mainstream community school.
- Provide busing for the R.T Alderman current grade 7s for the next 2 years, not just the 1 year.
- Schools K-6, 7-9, 10-12
- Keep communities together when bussing.
- Value the ability for my kids to walk or ride to school. Support healthy behaviors related to daily activity.
- It is silly to open the schools in the middle of the school year, open the new schools in September.
- Maintain a regular program at Andrew Sibbald at all costs. Share the building if necessary.
- Lack of information shared with parents and staff is only increasing anxiety for this coming school year.
- Keep Cranston & Copperfield kids at R.T Alderman for the next 2 years.
- Merge schools if necessary to create a strong regular program only school. Kids remain close to home and don't complete with alternative.
- Increase population at Andrew Sibbald by changing to K-6(relieves pressure at Nickle)
- Offer K-6 at Andrew Sibbald to keep it open. Offer full day kindergarten to make school attractive to working parents.
- Andrew Sibbald changed to K-6 please!
- We moved to Lake Bonavista for their great community school, so have many preschool families.
- Andrew Sibbald could become a K-6 or a K-9 program. It is a great community school & would be a shame to change it.
- Local schools are integral to a community. They are such an important aspect of how a community interacts with itself and they are critical to ensuring the next generation of Calgarians understands the positive impact good community relations have on all the community's members.
- Andrew Sibbald: keep it a regular program school and expand to K-6 possible even K-9.
- Dual track approach

We have a solid community of parents/volunteers who in 2016 -2017 will be the only continuity to the school. We have written grants and fundraised over \$220,000. We bought a house in Lake Bonavista because there were a few school options we chose Andrew Sibbald because we believe that strong community schools are important for the overall community. In the 4 years we've been involved in the school, there has been a large amount of turnover because of the Auburn Bay Community joining and then leaving. 2 changes of principals within 2 years. We are ready for Andrew Sibbald to be a good solid school rather than a dumping ground for other communities and staff members who want in the last two years to make our school better and we would like the CBE to help us build up the school by making it more attractive to community members. Enrolment will rise with a transition to K-6. Keep the current grade 4's and have an Andrew Sibbald gr.5 class in 2016 -2017. This would be a start. I have a child starting kindergarten 2016 and many of his preschool peers are choosing other schools, but I would pick Andrew Sibbald if it were K-6.
