



- Transportation Engagement

- Deficit \$6M

- Bill 1 Implemented
- Transportation service level adjustment year 1
- Deficit \$6M
- Fee \$335/yr











2018-19

- Transportation service level adjustment year 2
- Deficit \$3M
- Fee \$350/yr

#### Transportation – into the future









2019-20

- Bill 28 Student Transportation Regulation changes
- Increasing costs
- Increasing specialized transportation need
- Fee increase recommendation
   \$15 (4.3%) from \$350 to \$365/yr

- 2/3 of people engage looking for interpersonal relationships
- 161 hours per year
- \$3.9 billion to the Calgary economy
- 5 minutes and 33 seconds on the Volunteer Connector
- Loneliness increases the risk of mortality more than smoking, excessive drinking or sedentary lifestyle
- Family
- 8 in10 Canadians participate in informal volunteering


#### IMPACT


