

- Cbe-learn will be the online option for 2021-22
- Cbe-learn has operated for 20 years

Next Steps

- If you would like your child to learn online, you must complete a transfer request in April
- Cbe-learn is a full-year commitment
- Full time for Grades 1-9
- Full time is prioritized for Grades 10-12, but may be parttime if spaces and resources allow



2021-22 Budget

- Feb. 25: provincial budget released
 - Overall operational budget maintained
 - Capital maintenance funding front-loaded
- By Mar. 31: school board funding released
 - Funding will be maintained or increased
- Apr. 6: budget assumptions report
 - Schools will receive their individual budgets soon after
- By May 31: budget comes to two public board meetings for questions and debate
 - Budget is then submitted to Alberta Education
 - Any request to use reserves must be approved by the education minister
