



Three Year School Capital Plan 2024-27

The Three-Year School Capital Plan was approved on March 21. Year 1 priorities include:

Cornerstone HS (planning)	Crescent Heights HS (modernization request)
Redstone Elementary (new request)	A.E. Cross School (pre-planning)
Saddle Ridge Middle (Pre-planning)	Sir John A. Macdonald School (pre-planning)











Transportation Update

- Alberta Education announced additional funding for transportation
- This will mean changes to service levels and fees effective Sept. 2024
- Possible changes schools may see include:
 - New walk zone(s)
 - Adjusted bell times
 - Bus zones introduced/extended
 - New route combinations/partnerships
 - Service provider changes
- We are working closely with Alberta Education to learn more and will share updates when available


