



Current Context

- CBE received \$85M more than last year. Total Alberta Education funding = \$1.4B
- Budget increase is based on enrolment growth only. Inflationary costs were not addressed.
- Significant enrolment growth in past three years
 - Past three years welcomed 15,600+ students
 - Projecting additional 9,000 students next year
- Student population becoming increasingly diverse and complex









Budget Planning for 2024-25


Board Advocacy Points

Budget 2024-25 does not provide the funding necessary for a growing school district.

- The CBE received an increase to provincial funding to account for increased enrolment.
- Provincial budget does not address inflation and the real cost of supporting students with increasingly complex learning needs.
- In its 2024-27 fiscal plan, government has committed to funding levels below growth and inflation.

Funding enrolment growth without addressing inflationary pressures results in growing class sizes and services and supports that don't keep pace with enrolment growth and need.

CPI Inflation Adjusted Funding per Student




 Note the funding per student amount of \$8,821 is inclusive of the ATA salary settlement whereas \$8,664 is exclusive of the settlement.

How the CBE is Managing Growth

- Schools are using staffrooms, learning commons and other spaces for classroom learning
- In schools that are full, new registering students are overflowed to other schools with space
- Monitoring enrolment and long-term space planning including redesignating communities
- Relocating 6 modular classrooms using CBE capital reserves for high priority schools. This is in addition to the funding for modulars received from government



68 modular classrooms (2,040 student spaces)	12 modular classrooms (360 student spaces)
