Using school spaces for School Council events

As a follow-up to questions raised at the April 11 COSC meeting, we wanted to provide some clarity on the use of school spaces for various activities.

School Sponsored activities: Activities that the school principal or their teacher-certificated designate is involved in the planning, organizing and active supervision for the benefit of the school. These events are usually supported by the school council and volunteers and follow CBE policies and procedures. The school can book the space and the event is covered by CBE insurance. Examples of school-sponsored events include: Sports Day, School Celebration, Fun Lunches etc. usually held during school hours.

School Council or Parent Society Activities: Those activities that the school council or parent society takes the lead on planning, organizing and actively supervising for the benefit of the school. These activities do not require the participation of the school principal or teachers is not required. For these types of events, space needs to be booked through the City of Calgary and the fee covers insurance for the event. Examples include fundraising activities like a Family Dance or Fair or Carnival usually held after school hours.

For additional information, please read our <u>Administrative Regulation 8004</u> Use of School Spaces outside of Instructional Hours. The school council handbook also has information on insurance requirements for School Council/Parent Societies. Talk to your principal if you have any questions.

Year-end reports requested by June 30

Under the *School Act*, school councils are responsible for submitting an annual report to the Board of Trustees. This report helps the Board of Trustees measure and be accountable for parent and community involvement. The school council chair is responsible for submitting the report to the Board of Trustees by the end of June.

Provincial Curriculum Development Parent/Guardian Information Sessions

Alberta Education and the Alberta School Councils' Association (ASCA) are working with the Association of Independent Schools and Colleges in Alberta (AISCA), Fédération des parents francophones de l'Alberta (FPFA) and the Alberta Regional Professional Development Consortia (ARPDC) to gather parent and guardian feedback on the Draft K-4 provincial curriculum.

Twenty (20) face-to-face meetings will be held in school communities across Alberta from May 31 to June 14, 2018. Two sessions will be held on June 4 in Calgary.

Each session is limited to 100 participants. Confirmed registrants will be notified by email with additional information including agenda and event details.

Alberta Education Student Transportation Survey

Alberta Education has an <u>online survey for</u> parents across the province to provide their feedback on what changes should be made to the current student transportation eligibility criteria. These responses will help the government determine if changes are needed to the student transportation system, and if so, what changes to make.

The survey is open until June 15.

The changes are scheduled to be finalized by government in fall 2018. This timeline will give parents and school authorities an appropriate amount of time – approximately 10 months – to adjust to the new requirements which will be implemented in the 2019-20 school year.
