# Mid-year Changes to Transportation Service Levels and Fees

Parents received an email on Dec. 11, 2019 outlining an update on changes to CBE transportation service levels and fees. For the 2019-20 school year, the majority of CBE students will have a <u>similar transportation service</u> as they had in the previous school year. We will continue to ensure the delivery of safe and efficient transportation for students. The proposed fee for the 2019-20 school year is \$365 and is subject to board and ministerial approval.
