## Grant Announcement | Enhancing Parent Engagement in Alberta Schools

The Alberta government is providing more than \$1 million directly to school councils to support collaboration between parents and schools.

Through the Alberta School Council Engagement Grant, each school council will receive \$500 to better support individual school councils and strengthen engagement with parents. This could include creating more school events that involve parents and developing a broader range of tools to communicate with them. See the [Alberta Government website](#) for more details. ## CBE to Recognize National Day for Truth and Reconciliation on Sept. 30

The Government of Canada has proclaimed Sept. 30 as the [National Day for Truth and Reconciliation](#).

The intention of the day is to recognize and honour residential school survivors, their families and communities. It will also ensure that public commemoration of the tragic and painful history and legacy of residential schools remains a vital component of the reconciliation process.

For the 2021-22 school year, **Thursday, Sept. 30** will be a **non-operational day** to commemorate truth and reconciliation across the Calgary Board of Education. This means there will be **no classes** and schools will be closed for the day. As a result of this change, **Friday, Dec. 10 will be a regular school day**.

The CBE asks that all schools recognize [Truth and Reconciliation Week](#) from Sept. 27 to Oct. 1, 2021. This week will continue the conversations of [Every Child Matters](#) and [Orange Shirt Day](#) and provides flexibility for schools to select at least one school day within this week to recognize Orange Shirt Day with students while learning about the history and legacy of residential schools.

## Reminder | Year-End Reports

Under the *Education Act*, school councils are responsible for submitting an annual report to the Board of Trustees. This report helps the Board of Trustees measure and be accountable for parent and community involvement. The school council chair is responsible for submitting the report to the Board of Trustees.

## Notification of Positive Cases of COVID-19 in Schools

Starting on Monday, Sept. 13, schools will begin providing notifications when families self-report an AHS-confirmed case of COVID-19 to their school. If families report a positive case to the school, you are providing consent for the school to send out a notice to specific classes associated with the self-reported case, as well as a general notice to the school community at the end of the school day. ## Fun Lunch Guidelines - Sept. 2021

Food guideline criteria around monthly fun lunches (Healthy Hunger, The Lunch Lady, pizza, etc.), and fundraisers.

It is the Principal's discretion in consultation with the Education Director as to whether a program/event will proceed or not. If an event/program is agreed to, the school must meet the following criteria:

1. Must follow the [COVID-19 protocols](#) (Alberta Government and AHS Reopening Guidelines for Restaurants, Cafes, Pubs and Bars, as well as CBE general COVID-19 protocols)
2. Must follow the COVID-19 guidelines for [volunteers](#). It is strongly recommended that when volunteers are involved in any foodservice supports they take the AHS [Food Basics Safety Training](#).
3. Must be able to manage the waste and recycling.
4. Where CBE staff are making, and/or organizing the ordering of food, all food products must meet Nutrition [AR 3047](#), CBE's Nutrition Criteria and meet the [Alberta Nutrition Guidelines for Children and Youth](#). All food products must come from a permitted source.
5. Ensure that CBE staff have the AHS [Food Basics Safety Training](#) (as a minimum requirement).
6. **No cash payments** for these programs or events; schools cannot accept or handle cash payments at this time.

**Please note** | Any foodservice supports that are **reoccurring** must meet CBE Nutrition Guidelines as well as hold a valid AHS Food Handling Permit.
