



Speech-Language Pathology Services



Speech-Language Pathologists (SLPs) are essential members of school teams supporting students with language and communication challenges to achieve their academic and personal potential. They facilitate student access, participation and inclusion in the curriculum, as well as in the broader school environment.

Our SLPs help students from Kindergarten to Grade 2 who have trouble with talking or understanding language and provide support for teachers to help students take part and learn better in class. SLP supports are also available to students with complex communication needs requiring Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) throughout the CBE.

Services

Services may include:

- Consultation and Coaching
- Professional Learning and Parent Sessions
- Assessment
- Collaborative Supports



Support Areas

The SLP may provide support in the following areas:

- Receptive language - understanding of oral and written language
- Expressive language - use of oral and written language
- Complex Communication Needs (CCN) – students who cannot use speech alone to communicate and may benefit from the use of augmentative and alternative communication (AAC) tools or devices
