- Possible solution to both concerns is before/after school care, with hours of 7am to 6pm for parents who work.
- Another possible solution is to make an optional, paid bus route available for those kids in the far reaches of the walk
- Reducing the speed zone in the community to 40km is an option (although I have little hope that this will slow down the speeders)
