


History of the Juno Beach Program

Historic Enrolment Story of Juno Beach

February 18, 2003 the Board of Trustees approved "The Juno Beach Academy of Canadian Studies" alternative program, to be housed at Sir William Van Horne High School.

The program opened September, 2003 with 112 students in Grades 7 – 9.

Relocation

December 20, 2005 at a meeting of the Board of Trustees, a motion to consider closure of Juno Beach, for the purpose of relocation to Lord Shaughnessy High School, was passed.

September, 2006 Juno Beach opened at Lord Shaughnessy High School with 182 students in Gr. 7 – 12.

Relocation

February 16, 2010 at a meeting of the Board of Trustees, a motion to consider closure of Juno Beach, for the purpose of relocation to Dr. Norman Bethune School, was passed.

September, 2010 Juno Beach opened at Dr. Norman Bethune with 190 students in Gr. 7 – 12.

Program Integrity

What Makes Juno Beach Unique?

Key Characteristics

- emphasis and integration across the curriculum on Canadian studies, leading to high school completion
- focus on team building, self-discipline and involvement in the larger community
- significant opportunities for students to implement and engage in democratic decision-making within the school community
- leadership opportunities including organizing weekly school assemblies,
 Remembrance Day ceremonies and school-wide events
- focus on Canada's role within the global community (past, present and future)

Program Integrity – cont'd

- experiential learning opportunities, locally and internationally, culminating in a grade 12 educational trip to Juno Beach, Vimy Ridge and other Canadian battlefields in Europe
- school uniform required to unify the learning community
- unique program opportunities include Canadian Military History and Drill and Parade
- adherence to the Four Pillars (leadership, citizenship, academic endeavour and fitness) and the <u>Juno Beach Academy Code of Honour</u>

Key Outcomes

Students will become

- capable, inclusive, thoughtful leaders
- respectful, responsible, contributing and proud citizens
- self-directed learners
- influential communicators
- critical and creative thinkers focused on Canadian identity,
 values and democratic purpose
- capable of a critical understanding and appreciation of Canadian identity and Canada's military heritage

Student Attributes

Juno Beach students are expected to:

- come to school prepared to devise, implement and evaluate qualities for democratic living with all members of the school community
- abide by the expectations set forth in the <u>Juno Beach</u>
 <u>Academy Code of Honour</u>
- support each other as positive contributors to their school
- regard leadership as an expectation not an exception
- wear their uniforms correctly and with pride






Juno Beach Program 5 Year Projection


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
3 Different Scenarios - Optimistic
